Dual Enrollment Classes

What are Dual Enrollment Classes?

Dual Enrollment allows students to receive both high school and college credit simultaneously. Classes are evaluated by a local college on their content, academic rigor, and instructor's educational background. The selected course that a college deems equivalent to one of their course offerings, is then approved for credit. At present, we have arrangements with both Keystone and Lackawanna Colleges for a discounted rate of \$100/credit. Most classes are three credit classes. Science classes are four credits.

Eligibility/Registration for Classes

Registration will occur on site at Mountain View during the month of October.

Only juniors and seniors are eligible for course credit.

Students must achieve a "C" (Mountain View standards) or better to receive course credit.

Class Payment/ Scholarship Money

Checks should be made out to the individual college. Registration payment is due by December 1st.

Some scholarship money is available through Endless Mountains Community Foundation. To apply, go to <u>http://www.community-foundation.org/</u> Click on the scholarship tab at top, go to K-12 and then dual enrollment. The application is there as well as description of documentation (tax form) needed. <u>Deadline for Community</u> Foundation assistance is October 1st.

Payment is non-refundable even if student does not achieve a "C" or better in the course.

Transferability of Courses

We have not been aware of any student who has had difficulty transferring a dual enrollment credit. We, however, suggest that you contact the college that you plan to attend and ask the following:

Will a specific class transfer to this school? Will the credit count as a general ed. requirement or as an elective?

For transfer credit, transcripts must be obtained directly from the individual college
